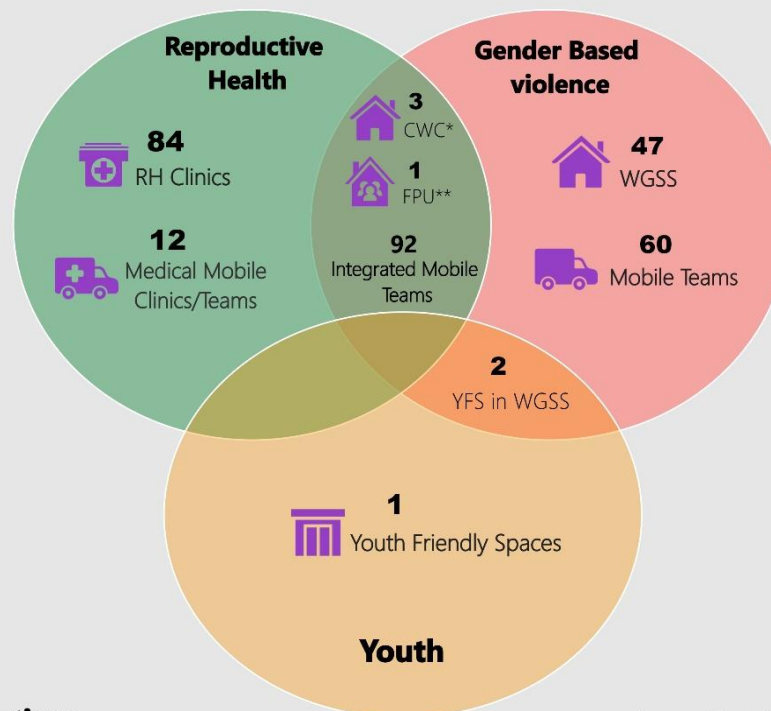

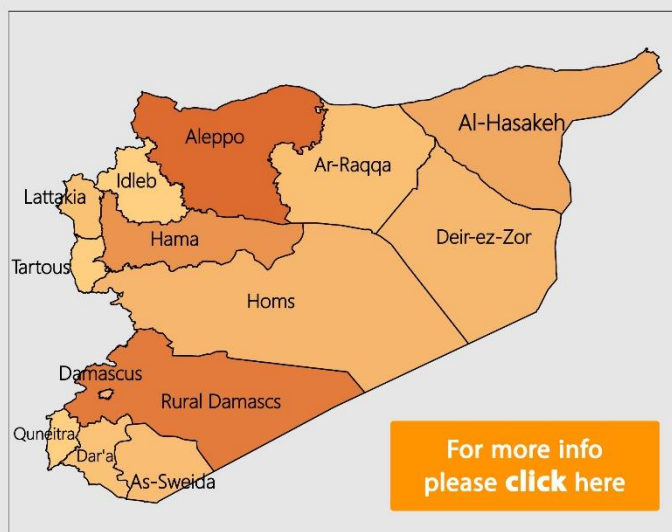
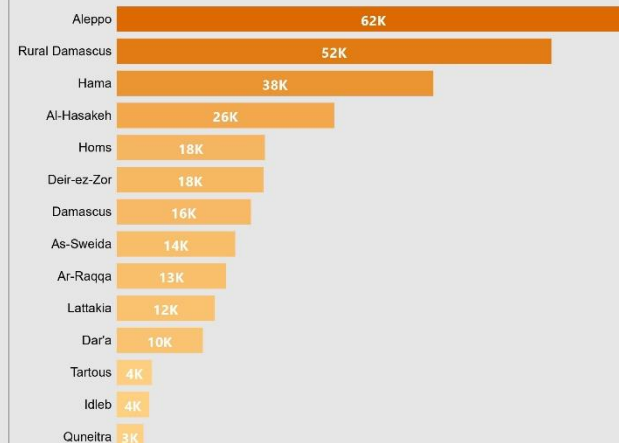

UNFPA in Syria is facing severe funding shortages in 2021. At the time of this overview, UNFPA Syria is only funded for 54% of 2021 funding needs. Health and GBV services and interventions will need to be cut and, consequently, populations will be left with no recourse to GBV or SRH services, if more funding will not be received. A negative impact will also be seen on the gains made and on new pilot interventions on specialized programming for adolescent girls, addressing negative social norms on GBV, supporting women and young people with disabilities and will jeopardize our new area of work on cash-based interventions.

Your support will have a positive impact on the most vulnerable in Syria and will be utilized to reach a world where every pregnancy is wanted, every childbirth is safe and every young person's potentials are fulfilled.

The scale, severity and complexity of humanitarian needs have significantly increased since 2019 due to a dramatic economic downturn, soaring food prices, and the rampant devaluation of the local currency, compounded by the socio-economic impact of COVID-19 and a protracted conflict. UNFPA and WFP joined forces to support the dietary diversity and health and hygiene of pregnant and lactating women from vulnerable food-insecure households through a partnership which is currently the largest cash-based UNFPA initiative.
